

The winner from each category went on to race for the grand championship trophy. Rebekah Thingvold, from the Bismarck Adventurer Club, took home the Grand Championship Trophy. Some of the young people were already planning how to creatively design their cars for next year's Pinewood Derby.









The next morning clubs came together to earn honors/awards at the Honors Fair. Some honors, taught by local individuals, were Drawing, Airplane Modeling, Candle Making, Fingerprints/Finger Painting, and Astronomy/Stars. There were experienced Pathfinder/Adventurer clubs at the fair who taught Trees, Endangered Animals, Fitness, and four computer honors. Everyone went home with at least one honor and some as many as four.

May TBD




