



Creating a Dementia-friendly Church, Part 6

Churches can provide a special role in providing support for people who have Alzheimer's and those who take care of them. Offering a welcoming, caring environment, or just words of encouragement, can go a long ways towards helping those affected by this disease. Below are three tips to give your church a good start to becoming dementia-friendly.

1. Look for ways to offer your support to families of people with dementia. Ideas include: provide a short (5 - 10 minute) worship service at their home if the person is unable to come to church; offer to sit with the loved one while the care giver takes a break; or ask if they need help on Sabbath mornings getting their loved one ready for church. Also, simply asking the family member about how they are doing and how their loved one is doing, and giving them time to share and express their



feelings of loss, joy, frustration, etc., can go a long way. Send a card or note saying that you are thinking of them, and provide ongoing prayer support for the family, as well as the person with Alzheimer's.

- 2. Be patient and respectful. People with Alzheimer's may need more time and patience if they frequently repeat stories, forget names and faces, or if their behavior or appearance changes. Practice acceptance, compassion, and show love. If the person becomes disoriented or lost, stay calm and help unite him or her with their family or care giver.
- 3. Continue interaction. When engaging with a person with dementia, be sure to smile warmly, and speak slowly and clearly. Maintain a calm demeanor and make eye contact when talking or listening to them.

Grand Forks Church Helps With Cleanup



Armed with rakes, leaf-blowers, and willing hearts, 19 volunteers from the Grand Forks, ND Seventh-day Adventist Church in Grand Forks, gathered to aid city residents with fall leaf cleanup. On Sunday morning, November 4, the volunteers met at the church with trucks, trailers, rakes, garbage cans, and bags, and then set out to help five elderly women and one physically disabled individual who were unable to do their own raking. Eighteen volunteers wielded rakes and one talented chef remained behind at the church to prepare lunch.

This annual outreach began as a service project of the Junior Sabbath School class five years ago, and last year it expanded into a Church-in-Action (CIA) event, including volunteers of all ages from the church. One Grand Forks resident has received raking assistance for all five years of the event.

Though the day started out chilly, the sun soon peeked out as the crews swiftly cleared the yards with enthusiasm and laughter. Residents were thankful for the assistance, and two ladies even gave tokens of their gratitude to the volunteers. One lady provided some delicious cookies, sharing how much she enjoyed baking. Another woman offered a large container of marigold seeds. She harvests the seeds every year from her own plants, which are descendants of a plant from Lake of the Woods, MN, 80 years ago.

When all the six yards were completed and the leaves hauled to city drop sites, volunteers returned to the church for a tasty and warming lunch of chili, cornbread and brownies. This event is one way the Grand Forks Church strives to be the "Church in Action," reaching out to the community in loving service as the hands and feet of Jesus.
