# **Bowdle Church History**

The following is from the Bowdle church file at the Dakota Conference Office. A booklet entitled *Bowdle Seventh-day Adventist Church Centennial* 1890-1990 reads in part as follows: (Part 2 of 2)

The Bowdle Seventh-day Adventist Church is still located on the corner of Sixth Avenue and Fifth Street, (Bowdle, South Dakota).

Sabbath, May 24, 1947 the new building was dedicated to the Lord. Special services began on Friday night, May 23. Sabbath afternoon the dedicatory service was presented by the vice-president of the General Conference, Elder W. B. Ochs. Remarks were based on Genesis 28:17, 19. The dedicatory prayer was offered by Elder Rustad, president of the South Dakota Conference. Albert Eisenman of Mobridge sang, "Bless This House" and Elder C. A. Renschler gave a brief history of the church since its organization. Elders Paul Kemper and H. B. Davis were also in attendance.

The 60th anniversary of the church was held November 2, 3, 1951. The Friday night speaker was Elder McKinley. Elder Jere Smith, president of the Northern Union, presented the Sabbath morning sermon. The Sabbath afternoon speaker was Professor Hartman of Union College, Lincoln, Nebraska.

Since then the church has been remodeled with the installation of wall-to-wall carpeting, upholstered pews, and a complete kitchen in the basement area. A sliding door has also been added which makes it possible to convert the fellowship room into two separate classrooms. This was accomplished in 1985.

Twenty-five ministers have served the Bowdle congregation since its organization, namely: Elder Valentine Lehr, 1889; Elder Wall, 1910; Elder Oswald, 1921-1923; Elder Goede, 1917; Elder Wentland, 1918; Elder Schwindt, 1924-1928; Elder Hein, 1928-1933; Elder Beck 1933-1936; Elder Reile, 1936-1943; Elder Beck, 1943-1945; Elder C Renschler, 1945-1947; Elder A. Rudy, 1948-1951; Elder H. Schander, 1951-1955; Elder H. Turner, 1955 - 1958; Elder Allen, 1958-1959; Elder R. Kurth, 1959-1961; Elder H. Preston, 1961-1966; Elder Samograd, 1967-1969; Elder T. Robinson, 1969-1971; Elder F. C. Petty, 1971-1974; Elder A Mitchell, 1975-1978; Elder J. Moon, 1978-1979; Elder J. Clarkson, 1980-1984; Elder VanHorn, 1984-1987; Elder A Hiebert, 1987-

1989; Elder Dave Devnich, 1989.

Through the one-hundred years of its history, the Bowdle church has been one of the stronger churches of the South Dakota Conference. The membership includes the Bowdle territory with members coming in from Java, Eureka, Tolstoy, Greenway and Roscoe areas. The WELCOME mat is out for anyone wishing to worship here. A christian education may be obtained in Dakota Adventist Academy near Bismarck, North Dakota or Maplewood, SDA Academy in Hutchinson, Minnesota, and in Union College, Lincoln, Nebraska, for higher education.

#### **Brentwood Students Make a Difference**



Finding joy in helping others is what teacher, Debra Eszler, is teaching her students at Brentwood Adventist Christian School. Eszler and Home & School leader, Traci Thingvold, have made it a priority to involve students in community service projects, but this year they have increased their efforts to twice a month.

Brentwood is located in a small, quiet neighborhood north of town with around forty houses. For years, Brentwood students have handed out cookie tins to its neighbors in December. This year the students visited the new neighbors who had just moved in across from Brentwood. After singing "We Wish You a Merry Christmas," the students shared a tin of cookies with the new neighbor. He was surprised and pleased and asked questions about the school. A couple days later the neighbor showed up at the front door of the school to donate a foosball table, telescope and guitar with amplifier. The students were excited about these unexpected gifts.

The local food pantry in town was low on food. Mrs. Eszler decided to have the students participate in a canned food drive. Students went around Brentwood's neighborhood and hung empty bags on doors with a note explaining what the school was doing. The next week they collected the bags of food. Neighbors saw the students at the door and were willing to give because "these are the students who always bring them cookies at Christmas." Eszler reported, "Neighbors are friendlier every year and are finding out that we are here." A neighbor brought his tractor and filled a hole in the school driveway, while another neighbor brought each student a homemade blanket for Christmas. Small acts of service are helping Brentwood make connections with their community. "Those who are the happiest are those who do the most for others." Booker



To expand their service to twice a month Ezsler and Thingvold researched the area and discovered Heavens Helpers Soup Café where anyone can come and eat for free or give a donation. Older students took orders and served food. Younger students folded napkins, waited on tables, dipped soup and filled cups with juice. Heavens Helpers have asked the students to come back soon. One student said, "It was really sad to see people so hungry. I am so glad I got to help, and I am looking forward to going back soon."



Another service project the students have really enjoyed is learning about greenhouse gardening. Mr. Dwight Duke, a farmer and member of the Mandan

Seventh-day Adventist Church invited the students to help plant 1,000 onions, seeds, and package vegetables for the Farmer's Market. The hands-on experiences have taught the students real world lessons about where our food comes

from and the benefits of hard work.


# Gioni Gessele Shares Testimony at Regional

At the Jamestown Regional held April 27, 2019, Gioni Gessele gave a short testimony about how God has led in her life. Gioni is the wife of Todd Gessele of *Totally Inspired Media*. They were in the Dakotas filming for the constituency meeting to be held in June.


At five years of age, Gioni was evacuated, as a "half-breed - that is what they called us" from South Vietnam at the end of the Vietnam War during Operation Babylift. She was one of over 3,000 infants and children rescued by the American government and concerned citizens. Gioni ended up in an orphanage in Saigon, separated from her siblings, against her mother's wishes. A German family living in the United States adopted her when she was six years old.

Years later, when she was about eleven, her stepsister became acquainted with an Adventist friend and suggest to her family that they should become Adventists, which they eventually did. Her parents sent her to Milo Adventist Academy in Oregon where she met Todd.
