Denoff Adventist Church Highlighted

The Denoff Seventh-day Adventist Church of Denoff, North Dakota was organized in 1917 (1916) after Pastor Conrad Hein held a revival meeting in the upstairs of Samuel Vietz's barn. Eventually the members bought a school house from the White School District and moved it onto a piece of land donated by Samuel Vietz (where the Fred Vietz place is), which was located four miles south of Denhoff. The building was remodeled and served as their first church home.

- · Ludwig Beyer, who lived in Denhoff and walked the four miles to church services.

A church school was held in the summer months of 1918 and 1919. It was taught in German by Reinhold Bietz in 1918 and by his sister, Frieda Bietz, in 1919.

Early ministers included Fauldin Lehr, Carl Lehr, John Siebel, Elder Kurtz and Elder Wagner.

In 1936 (1940), the church was moved into Denhoff onto a lot bought from Attorney George Thom of Denhoff. The material for the church remodel came from the roof of the old Fessenden Adventist Church, which was the first church in Wells County. Only material from the roof was used as the rest of the church was made from mud bricks.

As the years went by, members moved away and the few remaining disband in 1960. These members joined the Goodrich and McClusky churches.

The church building was used by the Denhoff and McClusky ladies for Dorcas (Adventist Community Services) until, due to vandalism, the insurance company would no longer insure the building.

The church was torn down to build a church school building, that was never built, so one of the members bought the lumber for ten dollars.

It was a Sabbath morning in the cold of winter as my family, my father, mother, grandmother, and I were all bundled up and in a small sled my father was pulling. It was not unusual during the winter for my family to walk across the river to reach the church. We had no car and the walk was about two miles. My father was the one to go to the church early on Sabbath to stoke the old pot-bellied stove so the church would be warm.

The river was frozen over and we had walked over it the prior Sabbath. As we were walking along my grandmother suddenly fell into an area of open water, which was covered with snow. She yelled, "Lord save me!" My father reached down and lifted her up out of the water and stood her beside them. She was not wet at all. You can imagine the heavy coat and clothes they wore when it was below freezing in northern Wisconsin.



Grandma looked down and said to Father, "August, your Bible is floating on top of the water." My father reached over and picked it up out of the water and there was not a place on that Bible that was wet. They all went on to church that morning to give the Lord all the blessings.

That Bible is right in front of me now. I remember them telling me this story over and over again as I grew up.

An Anonymous Donor Shares



Thank you Mr. or Mrs. Anonymous and thank all of you for your generous spirit as we point children to the Savior.




