

Interlakes Seventh-day Adventist Church History, Part II (Part I Next Week)

On July 14, 1879, at the first campmeeting ever held in the Dakota Territory on a wooded island of ten ares in the Sioux River, the Dakota Conference was organized under the supervision of James White, president of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. At this time a company of Adventists, located at Madison, South Dakota, was formally admitted to the new conference.

In the year 1887 the first Seventh-day Adventist church building was constructed in Madison, South Dakota on the corner of NE Third Street and Grant Avenue. Members of the church helped with the construction work. C. M. Babcock was the conference president at that time. One of the early ministers of this church was Pastor Floyd Weatherly, but the first minister to locate permanently in Madison was Pastor P. G. Stanley, who served the church well for many years, then retired because of ill health.

In 1915, an addition was made to the first structure making it more than twice the former size. Church school was held in the church for several years. Two of the former students of this school, Lillian and Sue Bidwell, are still members of the Madison church as is John Scriven, brother of Thelma Scriven, a teacher of that first church school so many years ago. In 1952 the church building was raised and a full basement was edified. This provided for a new heating system, restrooms and classrooms. Pastor Joel Nobel was then the minister in Madison.

During the fall of 1966 the two churches of Ashgrove, a small church north of Madison and Madison decided to join and to build the church we are worshipping today. The first construction began in October, 1966. During the interim, the Madison church members worshipped with the Ashgrove church. Pastor Eugene Wagner was minister at that time.

All members of both churches donated time and labor and gave liberally toward the new structure of which we are so proud. On July 22, 1967, a group of happy worshippers met for the first time in the Interlakes Seventh-day Adventist Church at Madison. An open house was held August 6,

1967 and on April 24, 1971, the church was formally dedicated.




