The Executive Committee is delegated the authority to act on behalf of the constituents between regular sessions, as hereinafter provided. The Executive Committee shall appoint such committees and shall employ such personnel and distribute its workers as may be necessary to execute its work effectively.

It is further stipulated that any of the 259 260 members, except ex-officio members, must have been residents of the Dakota Conference for at least one year. If the status of any elected member changes during the quinquennium, the Executive 261 262 Committee shall appoint a new member keeping in mind the guidelines specified in Article VI, Section 263 2.
